ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Nov. 26, 2013)—The nation's largest veterans service organization will be donating more than \$30,000 worth of physical therapy equipment, electronics and other gifts to the Raymond G. Murphy VA Medical Center on Dec. 7.
