VA's seal turns 25 tomorrow. President Ronald Reagan signed the Department of Veterans Affairs Act Oct. 25, 1988, to establish VA as an executive department. The legislation called for it to take effect March 15, 1989. With the elevation to cabinet level, a new seal was needed to replace the old Veterans Administration seal, and it needed to be done in only four months! VA employees nationwide were asked to exercise their creative skills to submit designs that best represented VA. In response, 187 entries were submitted. A 10-member panel reviewed them and selected a winner—David Gregory, a medical media production specialist at Indianapolis VA Medical Center. His design was sent to the Institute of Heraldry, the government's overseer of official seals, decorations, medals, and other items authorized for official display or wear by government personnel or agencies. The heraldry made just two changes. It added the stars above the negge and spelled out United States of America at the bottom of the seal, instead of USA. For his winning entry, Gregory, who died in 2004, received a cash award and a trip to Washington, D.C., where he was honored by Edward J. Derwinski, the first secretary of Veterans Affairs

SEXTING AND TRAVELING IN LUXURY AT VA? GO ON PAID LEAVE

An unidentified Veterans Affairs Department ratings service representative in Nashville, Tenn., who downloaded software onto his agency laptop to sext friends and misused \$31,000 in travel funds was placed on paid administrative leave this week

The VA inspector general last week released a report that detailed the employee's travel and sexting adventures, with recommendations that top VA management "determine the appropriate administrative action, if any" to take against the employee

The Nashville ratings representative managed to win the backing of supervisors for a job at the Washington-based VA Center for Innovation and between May 2011 and February 2013 traveled "at his own discretion" to Washington 34 times and took one trip each to Newark,

N.J., and Tampa, Fla., at a total cost to taxpayers of \$109,200, the IG reported.

Questionable travel expenses for this employee included "multiple valet hotel parking charges between October 2012 and January 2013, although [he] did not rent a car during these trips," and business class train travel, the IG said

In September 2011, the Nashville employee changed his departure from Reagan National to Dulles International Airport at an additional cost of \$383 because "he wanted to attend a horse show near Dulles," the IG said

After all this, VA decided to take some action this Tuesday – if you consider sidelining a GS-13 with pay action

"VA takes any allegation regarding misuse of departmental resources very seriously, and the department appreciates the Office of Inspector General's independent review," the agency said in a statement.

"VA has reviewed the OIG's report, and is in the process of determining the appropriate actions to take with respect to its recommendations," VA said. "The employee who is alleged to have misused government resources and engaged in other misconduct has been placed on administrative leave as of March 11, pending the determination of appropriate action to be taken in this matter."

FRA National President Testifies on Capitol Hill

FRA National President (NP) Virgil Courneya testified before a joint hearing of the House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees this week, asking Congress to work to reduce the large backlog of disability claims at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), expand presumption for Blue Water Vietnam veterans exposed to Agent Orange herbicide while serving off the cost of Vietnam, and authorize two-year funding for the full VA budget to avoid the agency having to stop providing benefits and adjudicating disability claims during a

government shutdown.

NP Courneys a thanked Sen. Bernie Sanders (VL), Chairman of the Senate Committee, and Rep. Jeff Miller (Fla.), Chairman of the House Committee, for their efforts to repeal the one-percent cost-of-living-adjustment for military retirees, including their sponsorship of legislation S. 1982 and H.R. 3789, respectively. Sen. Sanders' legislation also contained numerous FRA-supported provisions improving veteran's benefits. NP Courneys acited other issues addressed in the Association's full statement, including full concurrent receipt for all disabled military retirees, expanded suicide prevention programs, veteran's status for Reserve Component with 20 or more year of service, and reform of the Uniform Services Former Spouse Protection Act (USFSPA).

In addition members of the FRA Legislative Team meet with Personnel Subcommittee staff from the House and Senate Armed Services Committees, staff from the Senate Appropriations Defense Subcommittee and staff from the Military Compensation and Retirement Modernization Commission over the past two weeks. These off-the-record meeting allow FRA staff to provide the Association's legislative agenda to key staff members on Capitol Hill.

Senate Approves Sexual Assault Legislation
The Senate this week passed (97-0) the "Victims Protection Act" (S. 1917), sponsored by Sen. Claire McCaskill (Mo.), that reforms how the military handles sexual assault cases. Before the bill was approved, there was vigorous and extensive debate between two of the Senate's female legislations (Senators Kristin Gillbrand from New York and the bill's sponsor Claire McCaskill). The bill would prohibit military commanders from overturning jury convictions on sexual assault; the statute of limitations for military rapes would be eliminated; and victims would receive their own independent course in sex crime cases. The bill would also require civilian review if a commanding officer decides not to prosecute a sexual assault case. The bill now goes to the House for further consideration, and members can use the FRA Action Center at http://action.fra.org/action-center/.

DoD-VA Seamless Transition Update

The 2014 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) mandates that DoD and VA must have seamless electronic health care data by Oct. 1, 2016. Instead, the two agencies decided to pursue separate efforts to modernize or replace their existing systems. LHouse/Senate Discuss VA 2015 Budget: This week, the House and Senate VA Committees held hearings on VA's proposed FY 2015 budget. During the Senate hearing, Secretary Shinseki testified that the budget VA asked for was what they felt was need acknowledged that the request was put together before DOD amounced its plan to reduce troop size. With the possibility of a sizable increase in returning veterans enrolling in VA, Senate committee members commented that an increase may be needed. - 2. MST Bill Clears Senate: On Monday, the Senate passed (97-0) legislation to expand protections for victims of sexual assault in the military. S. 1917, the Victims Protection Act of 2014 would eliminate the "good soldier" defense and expand the role of special counsels for victims of sexual assault and rape by providing advice on the advantages of prosecution by court-nartial or in civilian court. In cases of dual prisediction, the victim gets a say between having the case heard by a civilian or military court. It would also extend protections to students in service academies, and require that in every decision regarding promotions in the military that a commander's record on the handling of sexual-assault cases would be taken into account.
- 3. Military Family Survey Ends this Weekend: With announced Pentagon recommendations to change military pay and allowances, retirement, healthcare programs and commissaries, it is now more important than ever for active-duty, Guard, Reserve and veteran families to complete the Blue Star Families' 2014 Military Family Lifestyle Survey, which ends this weekend. More than 1,200 VFW and family members already have. The survey is available online at http://inny.cc/2014/FW. The data collected provides real-time feedback from military families on issues ranging from operations tempo to pay and benefits, stress, caregiving and employment.
- 4. Two MIA Soldiers Identified: The Defense POW/MIA Office recently announced the identification of remains belonging to two soldiers who had been unaccounted-for since the Korean and Vietnam Wars. Identified are:
- * Army Pfc. Donald C. Durfee, 19, of Painesville, Ohio. In November 1950, Durfee was assigned to Company M, 31st Infantry Regiment, 31st Regimental Combat Team, when his unit was attacked and forced into a fighting withdrawal south of the Chosin Reservoir, North Korea. He was reported killed-in-action on Dec. 2, 1950.
- * Army Staff Sgt. Lawrence Woods, 39, of Clarksville, Tenn., will be buried as part of a group on March 21 at Arlington National Cemetery in a ceremony honoring the servicemen who were lost in an aircraft crash on Oct. 24, 1964. Woods and seven other servicemen were about at C-123 Provider aircraft that was shot down after resupplying the U.S. Special Forces camp at Bu Prang, Vietnam. Seven remains were recovered, but they could not locate Woods.
