But when he and the men under his care came under fire from four nearby Viet Cong bunkers on May 21, 1969, Erevia didn't dive for cover.

- 1644 The Third Anglo-Powhatan War begins in the Colony of Virginia.
- <u>1741</u> New York governor <u>George Clarke</u>'s complex at <u>Fort George</u> is burned in an arson attack, starting the <u>New York Conspiracy of 1741</u>.
- 1766 American Revolution: The British Parliament repeals the Stamp Act.
- <u>1834</u> <u>Six farm labourers from Tolpuddle</u>, <u>Dorset</u>, England are sentenced to be transported to Australia for forming a <u>trade union</u>.
- <u>1848</u> <u>March Revolution</u>: in Berlin there is a struggle between citizens and military, costing about 300 lives.
- 1850 American Express is founded by Henry Wells and William Fargo.
- <u>1865</u> <u>American Civil War</u>: The <u>Congress of the Confederate States</u> adjourns for the last time.
- <u>1871</u> Declaration of the <u>Paris Commune</u>; President of the French Republic, <u>Adolphe Thiers</u>, orders the evacuation of Paris.
- <u>1874</u> Hawaii signs a treaty with the United States granting exclusive <u>trade</u> rights.
- <u>1892</u> Former Governor General <u>Lord Stanley</u> pledges to donate a <u>silver</u> challenge cup, later named after him, as an award for the best <u>hockey</u> team in Canada the <u>Stanley Cup</u>.

- <u>1925</u> The <u>Tri-State Tornado</u> hits the Midwestern states of <u>Missouri</u>, <u>Illinois</u>, and <u>Indiana</u>, killing 695 people.
- <u>1937</u> The <u>New London School explosion</u> in <u>New London, Texas</u>, kills 300 people, mostly children.
- 1937 <u>Spanish Civil War</u>: Spanish Republican forces defeat the <u>Italians</u> at the <u>Battle of Guadalajara</u>.
- 1937 The <u>human-powered aircraft</u>, <u>Pedaliante</u>, flies 1 kilometre (0.62 mi) outside Milan.
- <u>1938</u> Mexico nationalizes all foreign-owned <u>oil</u> properties within its borders.
- 1940 World War II: Axis Powers Adolf Hitler and Benito Mussolini meet at the Brenner Pass in the Alps and agree to form an alliance against France and the United Kingdom.
- <u>1942</u> The <u>War Relocation Authority</u> is established in the United States to take Japanese Americans into custody.
- <u>1944</u> The eruption of <u>Mount Vesuvius</u> in Italy kills 26 people and causes thousands to flee their homes.
- 1945 World War II: 1,250 American bombers attack Berlin.
- 1946 Diplomatic relations between Switzerland and the Soviet Union are established.
- <u>1948</u> Soviet consultants leave Yugoslavia in the first sign of the <u>Tito-Stalin split</u>.
- <u>1959</u> <u>President Dwight D. Eisenhower</u> signs a bill into law allowing for Hawaiian statehood, which would become official on <u>August 21</u>.
- <u>1962</u> The <u>Evian Accords</u> end the <u>Algerian War of Independence</u>, which had begun in 1954.
- <u>1965</u> <u>Cosmonaut Aleksei Leonov</u>, leaving his spacecraft <u>Voskhod 2</u> for 12 minutes, becomes the first person to <u>walk in space</u>.
- 1967 The <u>supertanker *Torrey Canyon*</u> runs aground off the Cornish coast.
- <u>1968</u> <u>Gold standard</u>: The <u>U.S. Congress</u> repeals the requirement for a gold reserve to back US currency.
- 1969 The United States begins secretly bombing the Sihanouk Trail in Cambodia, used by communist forces to infiltrate South Vietnam.
- 1970 Lon Nol ousts Prince Norodom Sihanouk of Cambodia.
- 1970 The <u>U.S. postal strike of 1970</u> begins, one of the largest <u>wildcat strikes</u> in U.S. history.
- <u>1971</u> In <u>Peru</u> a <u>landslide</u> crashes into <u>Lake Yanahuani</u>, killing 200 people at the mining camp of Chungar.
- <u>1974</u> <u>Oil embargo crisis</u>: Most <u>OPEC</u> nations end a five-month oil <u>embargo</u> against the United States, Europe and Japan.
- <u>1980</u> At <u>Plesetsk Cosmodrome</u> in Russia, 50 people are killed by an explosion of a <u>Vostok-2M</u> rocket on its launch pad during a fueling operation.
- 1989 In Egypt, a 4,400-year-old mummy is found near the Pyramid of Cheops.
- <u>1990</u> Germans in the <u>German Democratic Republic</u> vote in the <u>first democratic elections</u> in the former communist dictatorship.
- 1990 In the largest <u>art theft</u> in US history, 12 paintings, collectively worth around \$300 million, are stolen from the <u>Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum</u> in <u>Boston</u>, <u>Massachusetts</u>.
- <u>1992</u> In a national referendum white South Africans vote overwhelmingly in favor of ending the racist policy of <u>Apartheid</u>.
- <u>1994</u> <u>Bosnia</u>'s <u>Bosniaks</u> and <u>Croats</u> sign the <u>Washington Agreement</u>, ending war between the <u>Croatian Republic of Herzeg-Bosnia</u> and the <u>Republic of Bosnia and</u>

Herzegovina, and establishing the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

- 1996 A nightclub fire in Quezon City, Philippines kills 162 people.

Openness and accountability are important to maintain the public's trust in the <u>Department of Veterans Affairs</u>, Secretary <u>Eric Shinseki</u> told a congressional committee Thursday.

But then he refused to answer reporters' questions about whether top administrators were disciplined for preventable patient deaths at veterans' hospitals.

"Transparency is an important aspect of our being able to establish and retain trust in this department," Shinseki told the House Committee on Veterans Affairs during a hearing about the agency's \$163.9 billion budget proposal for the 2015 fiscal year. "It's a high item on my list of things that we commit to."

Rep. <u>Tim</u> Huelskamp, R-Kan., confronted Shinseki about roughly 70 recent instances he'd found in which Veterans Affairs officials refused to respond to media questions on topics including <u>disability claims backlogs</u>, <u>patient deaths</u> and the <u>mass purging</u> of scheduled medical tests and procedures.

Huelskamp also pressed Shinseki about whether people in charge of veteran's medical facilities where preventable deaths occurred had been disciplined. Shinseki responded "we do hold employees accountable."

Six members of the Senior Executive Service, the top tier of agency management, have been "dismissed" over the past two years, Shinseki said without providing any details.

Last year, about 3,000 employees were forced out of their jobs agency-wide because of performance issues, he said.

When the *Washington Examiner* tried to question Shinseki for specifics after the hearing, he refused to answer and dashed off to a waiting elevator, surrounded by a cadre of his staff.

VA has been under fire for a <u>series of recent deaths</u> due to delayed or improper care at medical centers in <u>Georgia</u>, <u>Pennsylvania</u>, <u>South Carolina</u> and <u>Tennessee</u>.

At least 22 preventable deaths have been acknowledged by VA officials or identified by the agency's <u>inspector general</u> in recent investigations.

That includes the disclosure last month that a <u>sixth death</u> was probably linked to Legionnaire's disease at a veteran's hospital in Pittsburgh.

Internal VA documents indicate there were at least 10 additional deaths nationwide due to delayed endoscopic procedures, which have not been explained by the agency.

Shinseki did not address individual cases or specify facilities where discipline resulted.

At a Feb. 26 <u>subcommittee hearing</u>, Robert Petzel, under secretary for health, said three senior-level employees resigned rather than be disciplined in Columbia, S.C., where six patients died due to delayed care.

Petzel added "a number of people" retired or resigned in Augusta, Ga., where delayed care has been linked to three patient deaths.

However, the Augusta Chronicle <u>reported this week</u> that the former chief of staff at the Augusta hospital resigned that position, yet remains on the hospital's payroll in a different job.

Disciplinary investigations in Pittsburgh were delayed because the inspector general was conducting a criminal investigation, which did not result in charges, Petzel said during the February hearing. They are still under review and should be completed shortly, he said.

On the transparency issue, Huelskamp said he is concerned about VA's unwillingness to answer questions about its problems and urged Shinseki to be more open with the media, members of Congress and the public.

Shinseki said he would check into it.

The VA's public affairs office, which handles media calls, has 54 full-time employees, according to the current year's budget.

The budget proposal for 2015 includes \$95.6 billion in mandatory spending for disability and other benefits, and \$68.4 billion in discretionary funds that pay for health care and other services.

Medical funding for 2016 would also be funded in advance, which protects it from being suspended during government shutdowns such as the one that occurred in October 2013.

Channel 2's Justin Gray spoke exclusively to the head of the Veterans Administration about the management problems at the <u>Atlanta VA Medical Center</u> linked to patient deaths. Gray talked to Rep. David Scott Friday in Washington, who is demanding that the VA secretary resign.

Scott said he is not satisfied with the answers VA Secretary Eric Shinseki gave about the patient deaths at the VA hospital in DeKalb County. Scott has personally asked President Barack Obama to fire Shinseki.

"How in the world can he even begin to say he has his hands on the problem when he hadn't even set foot there," Scott said. Channel 2 action news was the first to report on Veterans Affairs department audits that linked the deaths of three vets to mismanagement in the mental health unit at the Atlanta facility.

On Thursday, Shinseki told Gray the Atlanta VA is now in better shape. "I believe we have the right leadership in place and the appropriate changes are being made," Shinseki said.

But Scott said he thinks Shinseki himself and other top managers should lose their jobs. "The buck starts at the top," Scott said.

Sources tell Channel 2 Action News that seven staff members were given written reprimands. Two, including the hospital's director, retired. But Scott said that's not enough.

"Those families right now have question marks as to whether they want their sons or daughters in the VA hospital and that is a damn shame," Scott said. "Do you think heads should roll?" Gray asked. "Heads should roll, they should have been rolled," Scott said.

An audit by the VA's own inspector general found that the <u>Atlanta VA Medical Center</u> has completed seven of the 19 changes that were recommended after Channel 2's original investigation last year.
